Details designated usages for KCVC:

Education: through the kidsneedfuture education fund, 17 children were able to join secondary school / college

Infrastructure:

30 **new mattresses** with integrated bedwedding cover were bought **teaching materials** (exercise books) for all 282 primary students were bought and the **computer course** was re-initiated

Assistance of food programme: through the kidsneedfuture breakfast fund all 72 home children receive a balanced diet with bread and fruits alongside the common porridge

Designated usages 2016 (II/II)

Micocredits for staff members: all staff members have the possibility -under to be met requirements- to get a loan to afford for instance medical operations, school fees for family members or to be able to start a small business, that sustains family members. Through a special donation from kidsneedfuture, a revolving fund was set up. Through that fund staff members can access loans up to a maximum of twice their salary. These loans have to be paid back including 5% interest according to a strict system of rules, definded by a committee formed out of KCVC staff members and confirmed by kidsneedfuture representatives. Since banks in Kenya offer only credit conditions that are not affordable for the majority of Kenyan workers, this fund contributes to empowerment (help to help yourself) and streightens the identification of staff members with the organization

Insight general developments at KCVC

- Establishments of the new management team lead by Chege
- Growing ratio of self-sustainabilty versus donations from 17% to 29% (Karai self-generated income to total income): Income generating projects have doubled their income compared to the previous year (total amount of 56.000€)
- The **primary school aquired 88 new students**, the total number of students by the end of 2016 was 282. All external students pay school fees and therefor bring an important contribution to self-generated income.
- A total number of **15 students finished their secondary education last year**. They will now continue the programme with vocational training or college. The **two college graduates funded by the kidsneedfuture education fund** are both in the process of job entry. Both have volunteered with the home in various ways (teaching of baby class, assistance of re-integrated secondary students, assistance of administration)
- By the end of 2016/beginning of 2017 17 new children (street children and orphans) joined the home
